Grow Portland purchases organically grown, open pollinated seeds in bulk and distributes them to local gardeners. We select productive and delicious varieties suited for our climate. Seed Club members help pack seeds while enjoying beverages and socializing with others.

Grow Portland is a new organization that helps people grow healthy food by providing supplies, education and land.

SEED CLUB GOALS

- introduce gardeners to tasty and productive varieties
- increase knowledge about appropriate planting dates
- foster community connections to meet and share ideas

DETAILS

Grow Portland purchases 35 seed varieties in bulk and provides the envelopes. Club members attend a seed packing session for 1 hour during a scheduled evening or weekend time slot. Sessions are held at different locations in NE and SE Portland. *Members pay \$25 and receive 15 seeds packs.* Members can also purchase additional packets. Surplus seeds are made available to schools and nonprofits.
